As I delivered aid as part of our Disaster Response Team to homes in the devastated areas immediately following the tornadoes, I saw first-hand how the supplies were a comfort to these people through a horrific time.

In 2019, we also helped those impacted by Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas, as well as other disasters. We sent humanitarian aid throughout the United States and around the world to continue our mission to help those in need. I hope you enjoy reading about some of the highlights from the year and can see how God has led us to care for the "least of these."

Thank you for your support. I'm looking forward to another year, and a new decade dedicated to serving the poorest of the poor and disaster victims. We greatly appreciate your partnership in this work and I look forward to what is to come. The rock upon which Matthew 25: Ministries was founded will allow us to continue helping those in need.

OUR MISSION

The mission of Matthew 25: Ministries is to fulfill Matthew 25:34–40 of the New Testament by providing nutritional food to the hungry, clean water to the thirsty, clothing to the naked, affordable shelter to the homeless, medical care to the ill, and humanitarian supplies to those in need around the world.

Additionally, Matthew 25: Ministries is committed to fulfilling Matthew 25:40 by educating people on the conditions and needs of the "least of these," and by providing ways they can help.

OUR PROCESS

Our mission is accomplished primarily by soliciting obsolete, slightly distressed or overstock products from corporations, organizations, and individuals nationwide. These goods include clothing, medical supplies, school supplies, personal care products, cleaning supplies, food, and other items essential for daily survival and maintaining an acceptable standard of living.

With the help of thousands of volunteers, these goods are processed at Matthew 25: Ministries and then shipped via forty-foot seagoing containers and semi-trailers to the poorest of the poor and disaster victims throughout the U.S. and around the world.

We supplement outside donations by manufacturing, assembling, repurposing, and reblending products in-house at our facility in Blue Ash, Ohio.



In 2019, Matthew 25: Ministries responded to the devastating tornadoes that impacted areas in Dayton and Celina, OH (more information on this topic can be found in the Disaster Response section of this report). In addition, Matthew 25 distributed food to local pantries and shelters through our annual Hunger 5K Food Drive, provided warm coats during our fall coat distribution, and hosted our annual Holiday Party for local children with life-threatening illnesses and their families.

Matthew 25 also opened the newly expanded Global Village Market in 2019, where volunteers and the general public are welcome to shop through an array of crafts and gifts from locations in the U.S. and around the world. Proceeds from the market benefit our work with those in need.



LOCAL DISTRIBUTION HIGHLIGHTS

700,000 POUNDS OF AID

were distributed to local partners, including disaster response supplies to Dayton and Celina, Ohio.

NEARLY 90,000 POUNDS OF FOOD

were provided to 45 local pantries and shelters through the annual Hunger 5K Food Drive, giving thousands of local families access to much-needed meals during the holiday season. Since the food drive began, over 1 million pounds of food have been distributed to people in need in Greater Cincinnati.

APPROXIMATELY 2,600 WINTER COATS

were distributed to partners in the Greater Cincinnati area to help the needy and homeless in our local community.

GREATER CINCINNATI

Matthew 25: Ministries continued the expansion of our local partnerships in 2019, responding to requests from more than 100 local partners. We supplied products ranging from food to personal care items to medical supplies, household items, school supplies, cleaning products, blankets, and clothing. These products help fill empty stomachs, keep homeless individuals warm during the winter, and also supply shelters with the items they need to serve the community. Matthew 25 is able to serve our local partners on a customized basis, providing a variety of products in smaller quantities that meet the specific needs of the requesting organization.



CAMP KIRKWOOD

Camp Kirkwood continued to thrive in 2019. Camper participation doubled from 2018 and we anticipate it will continue to grow with this year's additions of new lodging, more activities, and new trails. As camp participation has increased, the number of summer staff also increased. With students filling many of these roles, we consider it an opportunity to build and develop lifelong skills on the job, as well as encouraging personal and professional growth. We look forward to making additional improvements to the property in 2020, including opening the RV park area—providing even more opportunities for visitors to enjoy a stay at Kirkwood.

In 2019, 29% of Matthew 25: Ministries' distributions stayed here in the United States, helping over 5 million people in need. More than 4 million pounds of product was distributed throughout 17 states and included items such as food, clothing, personal care items, school supplies, building materials, cleaning supplies, and more. Through our domestic partners, these items are distributed to those in need including immigrants, migrant workers, active military and veterans, and American Indians.

We also continued our support of children in rural Appalachia this past year. In July, a team of Matthew 25: Ministries' staff and volunteers traveled to West Virginia and hosted an educational summer camp for elementary students, as well as completed maintenance projects on a number of schools in the county. In the fall, Matthew 25 provided outerwear for the students, including coats, hats, scarves, and gloves to ensure the children stay warm throughout the cold winter months, as well as delivering Christmas gifts for the children in December.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

In addition to our work in the United States, Matthew 25: Ministries also shipped aid to partners in 34 countries worldwide in 2019, helping over 13 million people internationally.

We actively support a number of special programs that are designed to meet specific needs throughout the world. In 2019, we continued operation of Bel Fle Missions Hotel in Haiti, which is dedicated to serving mission teams offering support to Haitian communities, as well as providing employment and training to Haitian workers. Matthew 25 also supports a large urban orphanage in Port-au-Prince, Haiti which houses over 130 children. Matthew 25 assists with job preparedness training and job placement for young adults transitioning out of the orphanage.

Additionally, Matthew 25: Ministries continued support of a program in Nicaragua which is working to reduce clubfoot deformities, as well as supporting the community of Paso Real—one of our earliest outreach programs in Nicaragua.

With Matthew 25's help, the area has become a vibrant, well-organized community where residents are developing agriculture, animal husbandry, livestock, and forestry skills that will continue to improve community productivity and provide them and their villages with additional sources of income.

DISASTER RESPONSE

Over 1 MILLION PEOPLE

helped through disaster response efforts

In 2019, Matthew 25: Ministries responded to natural disasters locally, nationally, and internationally, providing aid to victims of tornadoes, flooding, hurricanes, and wildfires. Nearly 2.5 million pounds of product were shipped in response to these disasters—helping more than 1 million people in need. Our Disaster Response Program provides aid to those affected immediately following devastating disasters, as well as continuing long-term relief to areas impacted by disasters months, or even years, later. These products and services deliver hope to those in need during the darkest of times, whether it be clean, fresh clothes for a family to wear, supplies to help them begin to clean and rebuild their homes, or simply a smiling face to show them that someone cares.





HURRICANE DORIAN

Hurricane Dorian swept into the Bahamas in September as a Category 5 hurricane and lingered over the islands as a powerful storm, devastating the islands with dangerous winds, storm surge, and flooding; destroying property and submerging entire towns. Immediately following the storm, Matthew 25: Ministries completed a series of airlifts to the Bahamas delivering over 10,000 pounds of personal care kits, paper products, bottled water, first aid and medical supplies, food, cleaning supplies, blankets, diapers, laundry supplies, and more. We are continuing to assist these areas by shipping containers of aid to our partners and are planning a medical trip in February 2020 to provide badly needed care to the affected communities. To date, we have shipped approximately 40,000 pounds of product to partners throughout areas affected by the hurricane.





DAYTON & CELINA TORNADOES

On Memorial Day weekend, strong tornado-producing storms moved across Ohio, causing extreme damage throughout the cities of Dayton and Celina. Matthew 25 launched a fullscale response, setting up a central donation and distribution hub in Montgomery County. Our response team of staff and volunteers distributed tens of thousands of pounds of supplies to communities across the affected areas, as well as completing over 900 loads of laundry. We have continued to serve these areas throughout 2019, distributing over half a million pounds of disaster supplies to our partners across Ohio.



Thank you so much for bringing food and supplies as we helped our fellow parishioners to clear out their demolished homes. After hours of work, food was such a blessing! God bless you all in the work you do.

Additionally, Matthew 25: Ministries responded to tornadoes in Alabama, Georgia, Missouri, and Texas, as well as flooding in Nebraska and Texas, and wildfires in California.

Matthew 25: Ministries determines how we can best serve the needs of each disaster region through shipments of supplies as well as through services provided by our Disaster Response Team, including laundry services, producing bags of ice, and the distribution of personal care items, first aid and safety products, cleaning supplies, paper products, and more.

Matthew 25: Ministries completed the first phase of our much-needed facility expansion in 2019. Our 34,000 square-foot, 45-foot-tall warehouse addition is now open and already housing thousands of pallets of much-needed aid. We also added two dock doors, which will increase our ability to ship truckloads of aid even faster.

CONTAINER OFFICES

Our facility has also been re-configured from the inside out, relocating the majority of our offices to another part of our building and adding more office space. Most of the new offices are built from shipping containers, which is a unique representation of our work with those in need around the world. Along with re-configuring our current facility layout, this newly added space will enable us to accept more incoming product donations, send out more shipments of muchneeded aid, welcome more volunteer groups, and help us help even more people.

We look forward to breaking ground on our next building phase in late 2020.

During the construction process our team didn't miss a beat: continuing to accept donations, welcoming volunteers, and shipping 746 truckloads of desperately-needed aid to 35 countries.

I had the opportunity once again to see Matthew 25: Ministries' mission fulfilled first-hand while helping our Disaster Response Team respond to tornadoes that devastated areas of Dayton and Celina, OH. It was not just an eye-opening experience, but incredibly impactful; witnessing the devastation of these storms and seeing the community come together to help their neighbors, family, and friends during such a difficult time. This experience was a great reminder that not only does Matthew 25's work help people around the world, but also those right here in our local community. In 2019, 29% of all products stayed in the U.S.—over 4 million pounds of aid distributed throughout 17 different states.

In 2019 alone, we shipped over 13 million pounds of product; the majority of which was carefully sorted and prepared for shipment by our dedicated volunteers. All these numbers truly attest to the strong leadership of CEO Tim Mettey, as well as the dedication of the entire staff.
